OTHER IMPORTANT RESTRICTIONS

J-1 AND J-2 exchange visitors may be subject to the following regulatory restrictions which can affect your future U.S. immigration options:

- **12-month Bar on Repeat Participation in the J-1 Research Scholar or Professor categories:** Any person who participates in an exchange visitor program in the U.S. lasting more than 6 months cannot begin a new program in the Research Scholar or Professor categories for a period of 12 months from their program completion date.
- **24-month Bar on Repeat Participation in the J-1 Research Scholar or Professor categories:** Any person who participates in an exchange visitor program in the U.S. in the Research Scholar category cannot begin a new program in the Research Scholar or Professor categories for a period of 24 months from their program completion date.
- 212(e) / Two-Year Home Country Physical Presence Requirement: Some exchange visitors will be subject to this requirement. If subject, you will be ineligible to adjust non-immigrant status in the United States, receive a U.S. employment visa (H or L), receive a fiancé visa (K), or receive U.S. permanent residency until you have obtained a waiver of 212(e) from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, OR returned to your home country and reside there for two years.

Exchange visitors will be subject to 212(e) if they meet ONE of the following criteria:

- Exchange program funded by U.S. or foreign country government;
- Exchange visitor entered U.S. to receive graduate medical education or training;
- Exchange visitor is a national or permanent resident of a country which has
 deemed the field of specialized knowledge or skill necessary to the
 development of the country, as shown on the Exchange Visitor Skills List.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

VAI's Exchange Visitor Program provides opportunities to study, conduct collaborative research, and participate in scientific training opportunities at Van Andel Research Institute (VARI) and VAI Graduate School (VAIGS).

PURPOSE

To promote the general interest of international educational and cultural exchange by offering educational, training, and research opportunities in the various fields of research conducted at VARI and VAIGS.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Invitation: Offer of invitation from a VARI lab or VAIGS.

<u>English Proficiency</u>: Sufficient proficiency in the English language to participate in our program AND to function on a day-to-day basis in Grand Rapids (determined by official TOEFL/IELTS result or Skype/telephone interview).

<u>Evidence of Funding</u>: Evidence of program funding in the amount of our estimated minimum Cost of Living for Grand Rapids (may include VAI salary or stipend, non-VAI salary, scholarships, or other sponsored funding).

Personal funds will NOT be accepted.

Educational Exchange or Research Collaboration Agreement (for Visiting Students and Researchers only): Visiting students and researchers must be affiliated with an overseas (non-U.S.) institution, and VAI must enter into an educational exchange agreement or research collaboration agreement with that institution before we will issue Form DS-2019. Please speak to your sponsoring VARI lab to determine if an agreement already exists or will need to be created.

<u>U.S. Immigration History</u>: You must not be otherwise barred from issuance of a Form DS-2019 (ex: repeat participation bars)

J-1 AND J-2 HEALTH INSURANCE REQUIREMENT

Per U.S. law, all J-1 and J-2 exchange visitors must maintain health insurance coverage for the duration of their program, which meets the following minimum requirements:

- Medical benefits of at least \$100,000 per accident or illness
- Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000
- Expenses associated with the medical evacuation of the exchange visitor to his/her country in the amount of \$50,000
- Deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness
- Coinsurance not to exceed 25%
- Backed by full faith and credit of a home country government or must meet minimum rating requirements established by the US government (A.M Best rating of "A-" or above; Insurance Solvency International, Ltd. (ISI) rating of "A-I" or above; Standard and Poor's Claims-paying ability rating of "A-" or above; OR Weiss Research, Inc. rating of "B+" or above).

Postdoctoral Fellows, VAIGS Students, and their J-2 dependents may receive qualifying insurance through VAI. All other exchange visitors must purchase third-party insurance and provide proof of coverage on their first day at VAI.

PROGRAM FEES AND COSTS

VAI charges no fees to program participants; however, you will be responsible for your own visa application and transportation costs. Estimated minimum costs of living in Grand Rapids are (per month): \$2,000 for the primary exchange visitor, \$650 for a spouse, and \$450 per child (VAIGS students may subtract \$150/person/month, because health insurance premium is covered by VAIGS).

These are minimal estimates for essential living expenses and include only: food, health insurance, transportation, rent for a 1 or 2 bedroom apartment (as applicable), and minor incidental expenses. Additional personal funds may be required and are strongly recommended.
